During the General Intercessions (the Prayer of the Faithful) we will pray each weekend for all those whose names are listed in the book. We hope that everyone will add to their own personal prayer the faithful departed and the promise of eternal life with God in heaven given to each of us at our baptism.

# Catholic Diocese of Richmond Office of Worship

*This year Christmas falls on a Monday, with the 4th Sunday of Advent on the previous day. The faithful should know that there exists the obligation to attend Mass for the 4th Sunday of Advent, and too, a separate obligation to attend Mass for Christmas (The Nativity of the Lord). To satisfy both obligations, a Catholic must attend two separate Masses.*

*A Catholic may satisfy the obligation for the 4th Sunday of Advent by attending an anticipated Mass (Vigil Mass) on Saturday evening, December 23<sup>rd</sup> **OR** attending Mass any time on Sunday, December 24th (including a Christmas Eve Mass). A Catholic, though, would also need to attend an additional Mass on either Sunday, December 24th or Monday, December 25th to satisfy the obligation for the Christmas Holy Day.*

*Because of the pastoral demands on the priests and other ministers, as well as the need to prepare the church space for the celebration of Christmas, parishes may choose to alter their Mass schedule for the 4th Sunday of Advent.*

*To that end:*

- Each parish is asked to celebrate an anticipated Mass for the 4th Sunday of Advent on Saturday, December 23<sup>rd</sup>, if the parish has a regularly scheduled anticipated Mass (Vigil Mass) scheduled.*
- Each parish is asked to celebrate at least one Mass for the 4th Sunday of Advent on Sunday morning, December 24th. The parish may choose to celebrate only one Mass, or more than one Mass. However, no Mass for the 4th Sunday of Advent should begin after 12 pm Noon.*

**Faith Formation:** Janet

- 1) Approx 150 new Mass cards have been ordered and will be laminated and placed in the church.
- 2) Liturgy committee wants to work with Parish Life to sponsor a New Year's Eve Lock-in. Janet will speak to Joy.

- 1) BB&T Debt reduction money: \$33,000 to be transferred to a money market fund and then two separate CDs as follows: \$30,000 in a 24month CD and \$20,000 in a 12month CD. Duane will meet with Tony in November to finalize the process.
- 2) HVAC paid in full now
- 3) \$60,000 remains in church savings
